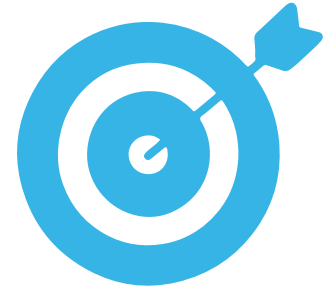

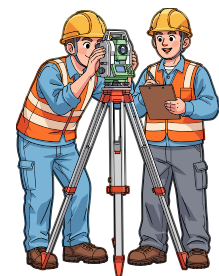

# Agriculture Program

## Macadamia Pilot Project

A macadamia pilot project was established, planting 94 seedlings to diversify crops and increase long-term farmer income.

strengthened the skills of Kasese cooperative members and FEM women in cooperative management and marketing.

Irrigation clubs started harvesting with 80% loan repayment.

# Agriculture Program

## Lime application trial



Conducted lime application trial on one acre to address soil acidity and improve crop performance using sustainable farming practices.

## Loan disbursement



Disbursed MWK 6,000,000 (USD 3,460) loan to Kasese farmers cooperative for seeds and pesticides.

## Crop production training

Trained 25 farmers from the cooperative (12 men, 13 women), in sustainable production of soya, groundnuts, and sunflower to improve yields and strengthen food security.



75 acres of OCA farm planted (maize, soybeans and groundnuts)

## Loan Disbursement

**A total of MWK 59,832,900.00 (USD 34,505) disbursed**

- ✓ MWK 32,853,000 (USD 18,946) in microloans to 88 members across six FEM groups.
- ✓ MWK 26,979,900 (USD 15,454) in medium-sized loans to eight qualifying entrepreneurs.

# Opulence Mw farm inputs Microloans

## Received in-kind microloans from Opulence MW

- ✓ 40 kg of soybean seeds to two women entrepreneurs
- ✓ 16 pails of groundnut seeds to FEM members



Repayments will build a communal Women Entrepreneurs' Seed Bank to support sustainability and food security.

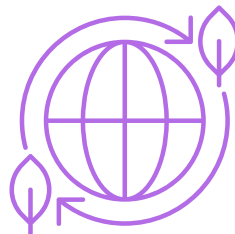
